Arrival by public transportation

Messe Freiburg is ideally situated for public transport links. On train line 4, there is a train going to the Messe Freiburg stop every seven minutes, which takes just ten minutes from the main train station.

Coming from the Black Forest and Kaiserstuhl, you can take the Breisgau S-Bahn (lines 1 and 11) to the Freiburg Messe/Universität station. From here, it's then just an eight-minute walk to the Messe.

Arrival by car

From the north and the south via the Rheintal motorway A5 Frankfurt-Basel, take the Freiburg-Mitte exit. It's roughly a seven-minute drive from the Mitte motorway slip road to Messe Freiburg. The route is signposted.

From the east via the A81 Stuttgart-Singen and the B31 Donaueschingen, Titisee-Neustadt. For Schwarzwaldstrasse, follow in the direction of the Freiburg-Mitte slip road. The route to Messe Freiburg is signposted.

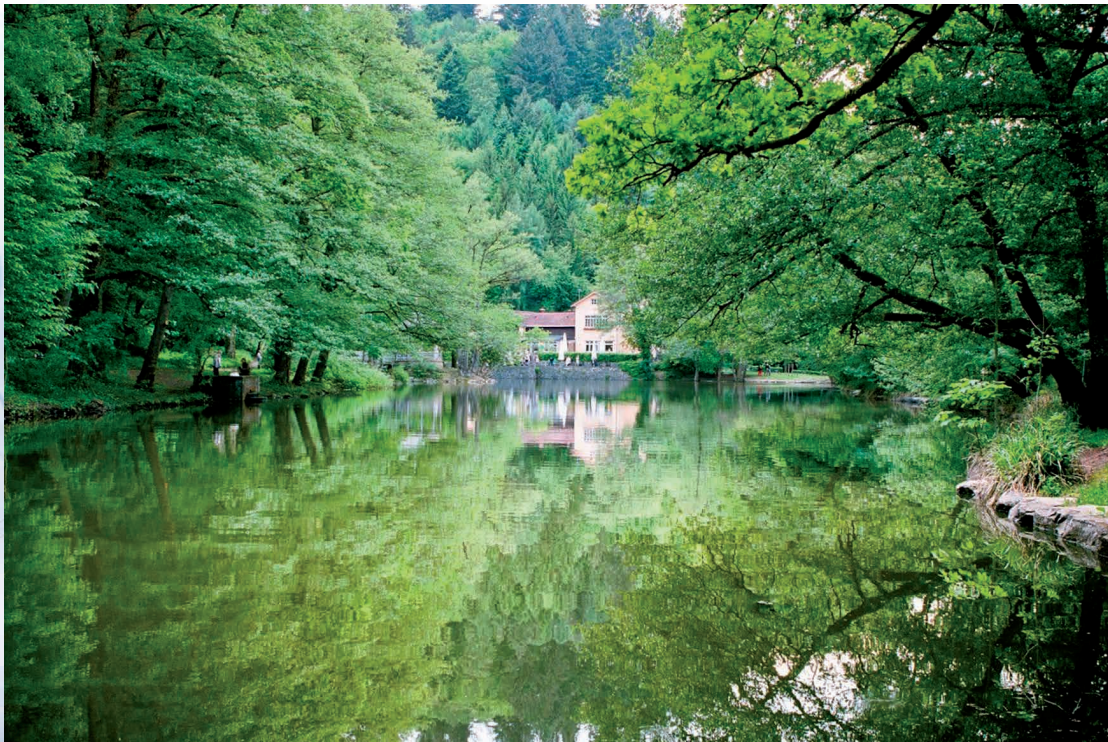
